The IONS-Project was officially launched in 2006 and has been growing into an ever more worldwide activity. Networking and wide visibility to research and researchers, as well as fostering career development at the industrial level are our most important targets.

Why in Valencia?

Valencia has a perfect location for a collaborative IONS conference as IONS-Valencia2015, with good transport connections not only in between Spain and Portugal, but also Europe and the rest of the world. This will allow that young researchers from all around the world come to Valencia to share their works and enjoy the experience. The last Europe conference saw 80 students from 12 countries.
